In a year where shelters nationwide saw a collective drop in demand for pet adoption (down 4%), The Oahu SPCA ended the year on par with the nation and just shy of last years' achievements by 6%.

To battle the declining interest and adopter pool, we offered more adoption specials, increased our weekend adoption events at Petco stores and community events, as well as increasing our ability to take walk-in appointments at the shelter to the best of our ability.

What is Save Rate?

The percentage of animals that enter the shelter and leave alive each year.

What Does "No-Kill" Really Mean?

"No-Kill" means saving every animal that can be saved. To achieve this, the save rate must be 90% or higher.

 **Did you know, only 62% of animal shelters in the US are considered no-kill?**

Thankfully, our Save Rate stayed above 90%, but was regrettably lower than usual due to a higher-than-normal Parvovirus presence, which caused the loss of several puppies; and the difficulty of saving neonatal kittens abandoned without their natural mothers.

IMPROVING OUTCOMES THROUGH FOSTERING

Fostering saves two lives– the foster animal in your home, and the one we now have space for at the shelter.

Shelters are stressful for animals, and while our staff and volunteers work hard to provide enrichment, it can't replace the comfort of a loving home. Fostering is crucial to our success—it helps us care for more animals and can be lifesaving for those struggling in the shelter.

Since launching our sterilization clinic, we've been able to offer the lowest-cost spay/neuter services to the public, while ensuring every rescued animal receives sterilization. The Oahu SPCA has played a key role in reducing the homeless animal population by over 60% since the clinic's opening in 2010.

At Oahu SPCA our mission goes beyond sheltering animals—it extends into the community.

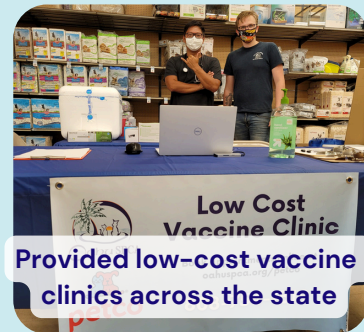

We launched our first Surf & Rescue virtual fundraiser and competition! Not only was it so much fun, we also raised \$11,000 for animals!



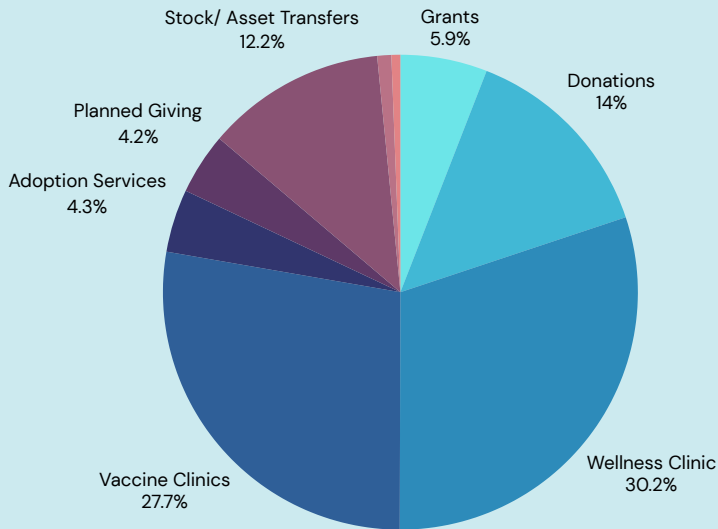
Quarter 4: Gabriel's Miracle

Rescued on the brink of survival, we were able to give Gabriel a second chance thanks to costly medical intervention and your support.

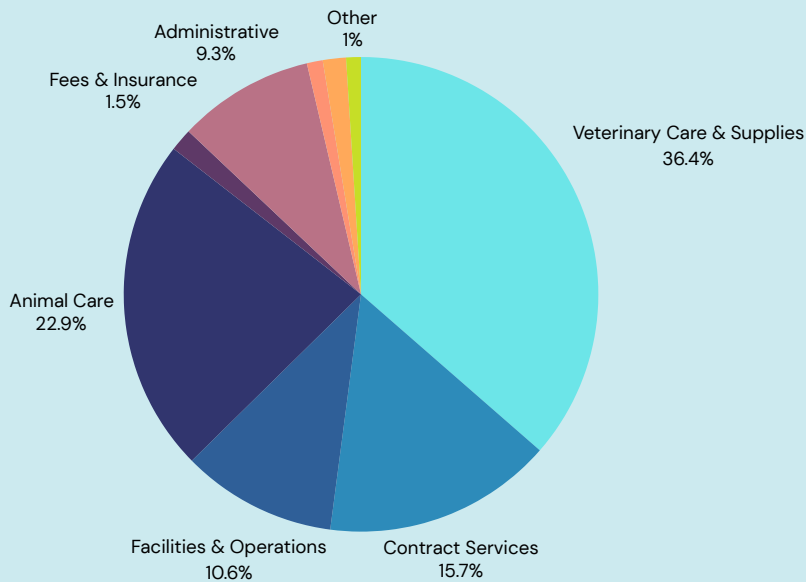
